Key Learning Objectives

- Identify the main factors that keep Planet Earth healthy and habitable.
- Understand, through examples in the SDGs, how the 3 pillars of sustainable development work together to provide a sustainable future.
- Define climate change/global warming and learn about the causes and the consequences to economies, societies and the environment.
- Evaluate how individuals have an impact on the environment through lifestyle choices.
- Link environmental issues with the basic rights of children and empower students to make positive changes and develop a greater sense of respect for the environment and a path to a more sustainable future.
- Strengthen teachers' and children's sense of civic responsibility and their sense of global citizenship.
